#### Dear Friends of Rosie's House:

On behalf of our Board of Directors, faculty artists and students at Rosie's House, I thank you for your generosity in supporting equitable access to music education.

Through your support, you have shown that you believe in investing in Arizona youth, and that you believe that all students, regardless of their economic challenges, deserve access to lifechanging resources. Together, over the past 22 years, we have created one of the largest 100% free music conservatories in the nation.

For Rosie's House, this has been another remarkable year. We closed the fiscal year on a high note, with a 27% increase in revenue from fiscal year 2016 to fiscal year 2017. Beyond our financial successes, Rosie's House developed new partnerships in the community, launched a new Wind Ensemble program, installed a state of the art Propel Piano Lab, and continued to deliver on our mission of transforming lives through providing equitable access to the power of music education.

During the 2016-2017 program year, Rosie's House provided a robust music education program to youth; providing over 14,940 free music lessons to our 425 enrolled youth with our nine programs:

- Propel Piano 2) Strive String 3) Aim Winds

   Musicians Mentoring in Classrooms and
- 9) College Path.

#### Mission Supporting Data:

- Confidence, Leadership and Group Work were the top 3 areas that parents reported seeing an impact after a year of participation.
- 100% of graduating seniors from Rosie's House in 2017 are now enrolled in college and credit Rosie's House with their success. Two students are on scholarship studying music at Arizona State University Herberger School of Music.

# 2016-2017 PROGRAM YEAR

September 2016 – Rosie's House begins the year with over 425 students ages 5-18 enrolled in piano, choir, strings, winds and mariachi.

October 2016 - Rosie's House is selected to participate in a year-long residency with Grammy Award winning artist Martha Gonzalez.

October 2016 – Rosie's House students are selected to perform at the Mayor's Arts Awards.

December 2016 - Rosie's House performs at Phoenix Art Museum and Beautitudes Campus as part of our Musicians Active in Community (MAC) Program, this service learning program teaches our students the value of giving back.

→ February 2017 – Rosie's House string students and piano studenets participate in master classes with the Faure Quartet. This lesson format is like a lesson with an audience, and Rosie's House welcomed 75 guests on our campus to watch.

March 2017 - Rosie's House performs at Banner Medical Center through the MAC Program.

♪ April 2017 - Rosie's House performs at the Herberger Theater alongside grammy-award winning artist Martha Gonzalez.

♪ May 2017 – Rosie's House hosts our annual Ovation Gala raising \$70,000.

♪ May 2017 - 100% of our graduating seniors will be attending college.


