

Dear Friends,

2024-2025 has been a year of tremendous growth and impact at Rosie's House. On behalf of the entire Rosie's House community, **thank you for your continued support**—and for believing in the power of free, high-quality music education to transform lives.

This year, we continued our evolution from an afterschool program into one of the largest providers of free music education in the nation. Through three programs (Afterschool, Summer, and Early Childhood), we deepened our commitment to all learners.

We expanded our Early Childhood Program, serving 114 children from infancy through age five. Through our partnership with Child Crisis Arizona's Center for Child & Family Wellness in Mesa, we offered our first-ever offsite classes, providing a joyful introduction to music and building foundational skills for school and life.

Our students' creativity was on full display as they inspired audiences across the Valley. From community music festivals to performances alongside The Phoenix Symphony, Rosie's House students shared their talent at nearly 100 community events, reaching more than 18,500 people and filling our community with music.

We are especially proud of our graduating seniors, who are stepping into the future as leaders and arts advocates. Their discipline and dedication have earned them **over \$1 million in college scholarships**, proving that when barriers are removed, potential is unleashed.

As we celebrate 30 years of impact, we reflect on the remarkable growth of the past decade:
